Kevin Neely brought a miniature version of a larger segmented bowl he had turned. We were told that the miniature piece contained 82 pieces and was more work than the larger version. **Danny Mareno** made an Urn from Wenge Wood and Pink Ivory that was 15" in height. Danny had no immediate plans for the use of the urn.

Chris Kunzle turned a work of art in the form of a vessel made from Pink Ivory that was suspended by the Zircote that was sawed into thin layers, bent and glued.

Boyko Varney turned a second sun dial, a twin to the piece that he displayed at the Treasures of Wood. It was made from Pink Ivory, African Black Wood, and Ebony. The dial was inlaid with Turquoise/Lapis/Onyx stones. Great job but wait till you see the NEXT project that Varney takes on.
