Start keeping those scrapes from  
your larger projects; the following is  
all the material you would need to  
make these beautiful, delicate  
ornaments.

1. Stock, 2.5 x 2.5 x 1.5” for  
globe
2. Stock 7.5 x 1.25” for icicle

Wood:

1. Wood for globe –any  
hardwood
2. Wood for icicle – close grain  
and flexible, Mesquite, birch,  
hickory, ash or maple are good  
examples.
