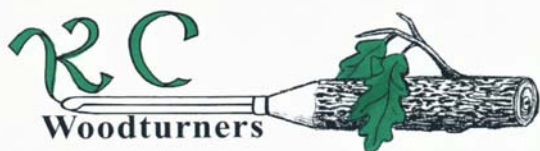

It was necessary to choose between Incorporated or Association. The Board felt Association would more closely identify us as what we actually are. I wish to thank Don Grimes for bringing this to a close.

This change is something that should have happened years ago. But it did not as it seemed to be a lot of hassle to do it. Director Grimes did not find it to be that big of a deal when it finally was completed.

There are several reasons this needed to be done. One—if and when we become a 501(C)(3) corporation with the IRS it will make that process simpler. Two—liability exposure to individual club members has been eliminated. Before this, each member listed on the roster could have been held liable for actions of the group. But keep in mind there has never been a claim involving AAW's insurance policy.

So maybe it is a moot issue, but having been in the insurance business for 32 years, I saw a lot of frivolous law suits and suits that named people that never should have been listed as a defendant counsel. The Boy Scout motto is "Be Prepared". I think we now are prepared for the future.

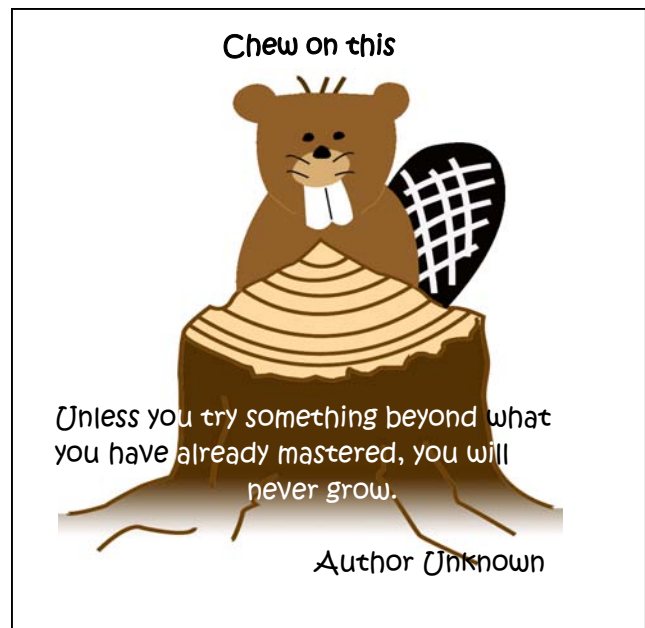

Sharing knowledge with a story, experience or tip, we can all benefit in *The Journey* of woodturning

During Spring Break the Bywater family of cocoons traveled to the island of St. Thomas for fun, sun and sand. Upon arriving we quickly turned into butterflies with the 85 degree weather. I have never been to a Virgin Island, but let me say the white sandy beaches and the turquoise water lowers the blood pressure.

I rented a car which allowed us to explore the island, which is only 13 miles long and 3 miles wide. Driving on the left side of the road increases the blood pressure. In fact, you almost have to be a New York taxi cab type driver to safely maneuver through traffic.

My plan was to spend one day over on the island of St. John's. I wanted to visit Avelino Samuel. Avelino is a St. John's woodturner who is passing along his skills to the younger generation. He was featured in the AAW's Winter 2004 issue.

We took the car ferry over to St. John's and I dropped the family off at the beach and drove to Julius E. Sprauve School. Hoping to catch a class full of students, I arrived

too late but did manage to speak with Avelino. He is starting his 25th year teaching industrial arts. I would say the emphasis is in woodturning. 5 Jet minis, 4 older Deltas and Avelino was turning on a new one-way 2036 (see photo's). Typically, he will have 16 students learning basic woodturning. If a student excels, then more classes are available. Avelino also teaches adult classes. Avelino invited me back for an after school turning class at 3:30 the next day. Prior to leaving, I gave Avelino some turning tools for his students. A special thanks to Edd Maxwell for giving me two spindle gouges for the students. Avelino is a very skilled woodturning artist. I photographed some of his current work at the gallery in St. Thomas.

Before leaving St. Thomas, my daughter, Julie, and I had to visit the Home Depot—a 2x4 stud was \$3.99. I think I'll buy my 2x4 for the Club Challenge back in KC.
