January's Demonstration

Ed Bergstedt and John Burright demonstrated the way Craft Supply turns pens at the Wood Working Show. Focusing on the basics of turning a pen using a spindle gouge and a skew, the ABC's of turning were the focus of the demonstration. The importance of A, anchor the tool to the toolrest first. Holding the tool, and making sure that it is in contact with the toolrest and you can move it across the rest, before B finding the bevel. Placing the tool on the rest with the handle well down and lifting until the bevel makes contact with the wood. Once you make contact with the wood, you can then start the cut, C. With the cut the part of the tool in contact with the wood should be receiving direct support from the toolrest. The spindle gouge is used to turn most of the shape of the pen. The skew can be used as a negative rake scraper to smooth the cut marks from the pen. Then



sanded to prepare for the finish. At the Show, we will be using friction polish on the pens. Starting with EEE Ultra Shine paste wax as the base before applying a friction polish, followed by Renaissance Wax. Once the pen is finished it is removed from the lathe and then assembled.
